

Our department feels that these families should be able to enjoy the many parks, programs and facilities in our community. SUNSHINE FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE PROGRAM: A Recreation Scholarship Fund. The NPRD believes in providing services and programs to CITY OF NEENAH RESIDENTS who wish to participate, regardless of ability to pay. If you would like more information on possible financial assistance an application can be picked up in our office or printed on our website. Eligibility will be determined on a case-by-case basis.

**FEES:** Resident / Non Resident: All registrants will either be a resident of the City of Neenah or a non-resident. Your residency is based on the city/town/village you pay taxes, not necessarily what your mailing address indicates. However, an increased non-resident fee will only be assessed for programs at the Neenah Pool (lessons and season passes) or when renting a park facility.

**RECIPROCITY AGREEMENT**: Residents of the City of Appleton, City of Menasha and City of Neenah will pay the resident fee for all programs and facility rentals in each city.

**CONFIRMATIONS:** When registering online or as a walk in, you will know immediately if you or your children are enrolled in a class. A receipt with class information can be printed. Mail-in registrations will not receive confirmation. Assume you are enrolled and plan to attend the first class unless otherwise notified.

**REFUNDS:** Full refunds are made if NPRD cancels a program. All other cancellations must be done by contacting the NPRD office at 886-6060 at least 48 hours before the program begins. A \$5.00 service charge per transaction is applied to anyone who wishes for a check or credit card reimbursement (we do not refund in cash) OR 100% of the class fee can be applied to your household to be used at a later time. w

**FACILITY RESERVATION REFUND POLICY:** Fees are NON-REFUNDABLE; if you must cancel or change your reservation someone must rebook that shelter and date for you to receive a refund - \$5.00.

ACCOMODATIONS FOR PEOPLE WITH DIABILITIES: The NPRD is committed to meeting the needs of persons with permanent disabilities. Appropriate auxiliary aids and services may be provided, as necessary, to enable you to fully participate in parks and recreation services, programs, and activities. NPRD asks that you register and request accommodations as early as possible to ensure necessary accommodations can be coordinated, preferably a two-week notice.



### **NEENAH SKATE PARK**

2119 Marathon Ave. (by Neenah PD)

This facility is designed for skateboards, bikes and rollerblades. It contains ramps and rails. The park was built with funds donated by individuals and businesses throughout the community. There is no admission fee. There is no supervisor. An adult should accompany young children. Soft drink vending machines are on site and restrooms are available inside the Neenah Police Station. Park users are reminded to skate and bike with care for themselves and others. All park users should wear helmets and protective gear, as riding and skating can result in serious injury. The park is a smoke, tobacco, alcohol and drug free facility. The Skate Park is open during daylight hours.




