### Minutes of the Sustainable Neenah Committee Wednesday, June 22, 2022 5:30 P.M.

# Hauser Committee Room, City Administration Building and GoToMeeting

<u>Present:</u> Committee Co-Chair Carol Kasimor and Committee members Dennis Kittel, Kent Powley, Merrie Schamberger, and Jim Wise.

#### **Approval of meeting minutes:**

MSC Wise, Powley, the minutes of the May 25, 2022 meeting were approved as distributed.

### **Presentation on Recycling:**

Jessica Hanson, Winnebago County Solid Waste Communications and Program Development Specialist, presented information on the recycling efforts of Brown, Outagamie, and Winnebago Counties. The Material Recovery Facility (MRF) opened in July, 2009 in Appleton and processes 105,000 – 110,000 tons per year, with an 8% residual rate (average is 15-20 %.) Jessica reviewed the history of recycling laws in Wisconsin, beginning in 1991. However, it is estimated that close to 500,000 tons of recyclables were thrown away in 2020 in Wisconsin by businesses and residential households, which equates to \$2.6 million lost to Winnebago County.

The Committee discussed what paper, metal, glass and plastic goes in the recycling bin, and what cannot be processed by the MRF, including plastic bags, shredded paper, food, propane tanks, sharps, cables, textiles, and batteries. These materials as well as polystyrene foam have other drop sites. Jessica recommended use of the Waste Wizard, which provides information on how to recycle or dispose of items (<a href="https://www.RecycleMoreTriCounty.org/Waste-Wizard/">www.RecycleMoreTriCounty.org/Waste-Wizard/</a>), and the Betterbin app, which will scan a product barcode that will provide recycling and disposal information. Ultimately, the goal is reduction in the use of items that are now recycled or disposed.

### **Discussion of Education/Information projects:**

The next Farmers Market presentation will be on Saturday, July 16, on the topic of recycling. Committee member Kent Powley and Jessica Hanson will be presenting.

The June 18 Farmers Market presentation on biking was very successful. Dennis Kittel and Jim Wise from the SNC and Michelle Bachaus from Wisconsin Bike Federation provided bike information and education. Dave Rouse and Valley Management provided bike lights free of charge to youth answering bike quiz questions, who also made lemonade slushies on the bike blenders provided by East Central Wisconsin Regional Planning Commission. Over 60 bike lights were distributed and slushies were made.
