Approval of Minutes of the meetings for September 30, 2020

Motion Second/Carried Lendrum/Lang to approve of the minutes of the Meeting of September 8, 2020. All voting aye.

Beverage Operator License Appeal:

Assistant City Attorney Westbrook reviewed the new process for obtaining a Beverage Operators License. The Police Department now reviews all applications for approval and denial. The new process has established criteria for denying licenses. One reason for denial under the new review process is being identified as a habitual offender. Under the new process, Mr. Drake was identified as a habitual offender for 3 violations within a 2 year time span for failure to have vehicle insurance.

Joseph Drake was sworn in by City Attorney Godlewski.

Mr. Drake addressed the committee in defense of his denial. He stated he has been hired by Dollar General. One of the conditions of his employment is that he is required to obtain a Beverage Operator License. He stated he has a family to support and needs the license. He stated one of the violations occurred when he was selling a vehicle and he had taken the insurance off of the vehicle. The potential buyer delayed in buying the vehicle and he continued to drive the vehicle until the purchase was complete. During that time he was stopped and cited for driving without insurance.

Assistant Attorney Westbrook asked why he had no insurance at the time of the 3 violations. Mr. Drake stated at the time of the violations he could not afford insurance. He currently has two jobs and has obtained insurance.

Assistant Attorney Westbrook informed Mr. Drake that it seemed like he didn't care or take the violations seriously. He let Mr. Drake know that the City of Neenah takes issuing beverage operator's license seriously and expects those who hold these licenses to accept the responsibility that comes with the license and be a law abiding citizen. Mr. Drake stated he understands and will send a copy of his insurance to the Clerk's Office.

C.A. Following discussion, **Motion/Second/Carried Lendrum/Lang to approve and grant the Beverage Operator's License to Joseph Drake.** Motion passed. 3-1 (Aldersperson Stevenson voting no)

WE Energies Easement Request-231 E Wisconsin Ave

Director Kaiser reviewed his memo of September 23, 2020. The easement is for the placement of a transformer which will serve a parking lot light and the Masonic Lodge. It is a 10-foot easement that runs along the east side of the city property at 231 E Wisconsin Avenue. Director Kaiser talked to We Energies relative to the placement of the transformer and this was the most suitable location. Director Kaiser further stated he received correspondence late Tuesday from We Energies asking that Spectrum be incorporated in the easement for a pedestal installation.

Director Kaiser stated for the council packet he will have the revised easement that includes the Spectrum language.

Director Kaiser stated there is different language in this easement that states if the city, in the future, develops this property, We Energies and Spectrum would need to relocate their equipment at their own cost.

Aldersperson Stevenson asked what other locations were considered. Director Kaiser stated there were two other locations considered, the right-of-way in front of 231 E Wisconsin Avenue and in front of the Masonic Lodge. He stated from a visibility standpoint, those options were less desirable.

Aldersperson Bates asked what the proposed easement site is currently used for. Director Kaiser stated it is greenspace and a side yard buffer for the parking lot.

Report Following discussion, **Motion/Second/Carried Stevenson/Lang to recommend Council approval of the Easement for We Energies work request 4437057 for the installation of a transformer at 231 E Wisconsin Avenue.** All voting aye.

Public Works General Construction and Department Activity:

- 1) Contract 7-19 (Breezewood Sanitary Sewer) – Work is complete.
- 2) Contract 1-20 (Abby, Bond, Center, Clybourn) Utility work is complete. Concrete repairs should be complete by 9/28. Landscaping is ongoing. Road grading will start the week of 9/28.

- 3) Contract 2-20 (Utilities - Van, Monroe) – Work is complete. A final estimate is being prepared
- 4) Contract 3-20 (Street - Van, Monroe, Gillingham)
 - a) Gillingham, Van, Monroe, Cavalry – Work is complete.
 - b) Shootingstar – Work is on hold pending resolution of boundary issues. A CSM is being prepared.
- 5) Contract 4-20 (Green Bay, Tullar, Marathon)
 - a) Tullar, Marathon – Work is complete.
 - b) Green Bay – Water main work is complete. Water service work is scheduled for completion on 9/25. Road excavation is scheduled to start the week of 9/28.
- 6) Contract 5-20 (Utilities - Lakeshore) – Utility work is complete except for the northernmost storm sewer outfall.
- 7) Contract 6-20 (Millview Drive Utility Relocation) – Work started on 9/24 with saw cutting and pavement removal. Traffic on Main Street has been shifted to the south half of the road. Millview Drive is closed.
- 8) Contract 7-20 (Fire 32 Roof) – Work is complete except for replacement of the skylights, which are still on order.
- 9) Contract 9-20 (Misc. Asphalt Pavement Repairs) – Work has not been scheduled.
- 10) Contract 10-20 (Misc. Concrete Pavement and Sidewalk Repair) – Pavement repairs are ongoing. Miscellaneous sidewalk repairs will follow.
- 11) Contract 11-20 (Street - Lakeshore) – Archaeology investigation is ongoing. Staff provided Council with a memo updating the status of that work. We are meeting with archaeology stakeholders to clarify the revised mitigation scope and procedures to follow during the excavation monitoring. Tree removal and trimming is complete with the exception of one ash tree. City crews are air excavating in sensitive areas around the trees near the trail.

Alderson Stevenson stated the Bridgewood project is now complete. He asked for the volume of wastewater that was put into our sanitary sewer system and the cost to the foundry. Director Kaiser will look into this and provide the information.

Alderson Bates asked for a tour of the Bridgewood site where the potential Jewelers Park trail is to be constructed.

Alderson Lendrum asked if there is any grant money available for the Jewelers Park Trail.

Director Kaiser stated we applied for the Multimodal Local Supplement Grant for this project. He said there was discussion for other grants through the Convention & Visitors Bureau.

Mayor Kaufert stated the City is talking to the CVB and Jewelers Mutual. He noted that another business is also interested.

RE: Revocable Occupancy Permit – 617 E. Wisconsin Avenue

Michael Geall, owner of 617 E. Wisconsin Avenue, contacted the city with a request to occupy a small portion of the S. Park Avenue right-of-way. Following work conducted by WE Energies along S. Park Avenue last summer, the property owner replaced most of the landscape plantings along S. Park Avenue and had plans of replacing the existing 6-foot tall chainlink fence with a 6-foot tall wrought iron fence. The fence was proposed to be replaced in its current location which happens to be about 2 feet into the S. Park Avenue right-of-way. Due to the location of the new plantings and WE Energies ground equipment and underground infrastructure, the fence cannot be relocated back on the property. The proposed location of the new fence would be on the east side of the sidewalk and about 2 feet into the right-of-way as it has been located since at least mid-1970. The attached revocable occupancy permit is a formal way to allow the property owner to occupy the additional space in the right-of-way that is needed for the fence. If, in the unlikely event that the city needs the space for street or sidewalk purposes, the property owner can be required to remove the encroachment.

The revocable occupancy permit, location map, streetview photo, and property owner sketch is attached to this memo below. Staff has reviewed the request and determined that it can be granted without impact on the use of the sidewalk along S. Park Avenue.

Staff recommends Council approval of the Revocable Occupancy Permit to Michael Geall for installation of a fence on S. Park Avenue for his property located at 617 E. Wisconsin Avenue.

Note from property owner:

Hi Brad, it's going to be difficult to move the fence from the existing location, because as part of the recent work along South Park by WE Energies replacing the overhead lines, WE Energies added a transformer just inside the existing fence. See the attached photo. They also drilled underneath the property in a line along that transformer, so any anchors for the fence would penetrate that line. They have granted us a letter to replace the existing fence, but not move it over their infrastructure.

Encroachment Location: That portion of S. Park Avenue described as being part of the Northeast ¼ of the Southeast ¼ and the Southeast ¼ of the Northeast ¼ of Section 27, Township 20 North, Range 17 East, being part of the right-of-way for S. Park Avenue, 1st Addition to Lakeview, City of Neenah, Winnebago County, Wisconsin, contained in the following:

Lying westerly of the East line of S. Park Avenue;
Lying easterly of the East edge of sidewalk as currently laid on S. Park Avenue, being approximately three (3) feet west of the east line of S. Park Avenue;
Lying northerly of a line parallel to and 24.5 feet north of the extended line of Lot 2, First Addition to Lakeview;
Lying southerly of the extended south edge of sidewalk as laid on E. Wisconsin Avenue, being approximately five (5) feet north of the south line of E. Wisconsin Avenue.

Encroachment Description: Fence.

The use and occupancy of Highway right of way under this permit is conditioned upon the Occupant's compliance with these provisions:

1. This permit only authorizes the described encroachment to remain temporarily within the S. Park Avenue right-of-way.
2. In the event that the Agency deems it necessary to revoke this permit on the basis of a need to expand capacity or improve safety, the Agency reserves the right to give notice regarding the removal of the described encroachment. The Agency may terminate this permit upon thirty (30) days written notice to the Occupant. The Occupant shall remove the described encroachment maintained under this permit within the time specified in the notice.
3. In the event the subject property is subdivided into 2 or more separate parcels, the fence along S. Park Avenue shall comply with the regulations in place at time of subdivision.
4. If the Agency determines that the installation or use of the described encroachment authorized under this permit increases the difficulty of highway maintenance, creates conditions adverse to the best interests of the highway users, the general public, or presents a threat to highway safety, then the Occupant, upon notification by the Agency shall promptly remove the encroachment from the highway right of way.
5. Failure by the Occupant to comply with the provisions of this permit is cause for the Agency to terminate this permit and to require the Occupant to take immediate action to clear the right of way to a safe condition.
6. Issuance of this permit shall not be construed as a waiver of the Occupant's obligation to comply with any more restrictive requirements imposed by local ordinance.
7. Occupant shall provide the City with a Certificate of Liability Insurance naming the City of Neenah its officers, council members, agents, employees, and authorized volunteers as additional insured(s) with no exclusions in the form of General Commercial Liability Insurance. The Occupant agrees to indemnify the City for any applicable deductibles under the policy.
8. Occupant is responsible for the installation and all maintenance of the encroachment. Occupant shall obtain all necessary permits for the installation of the encroachment.

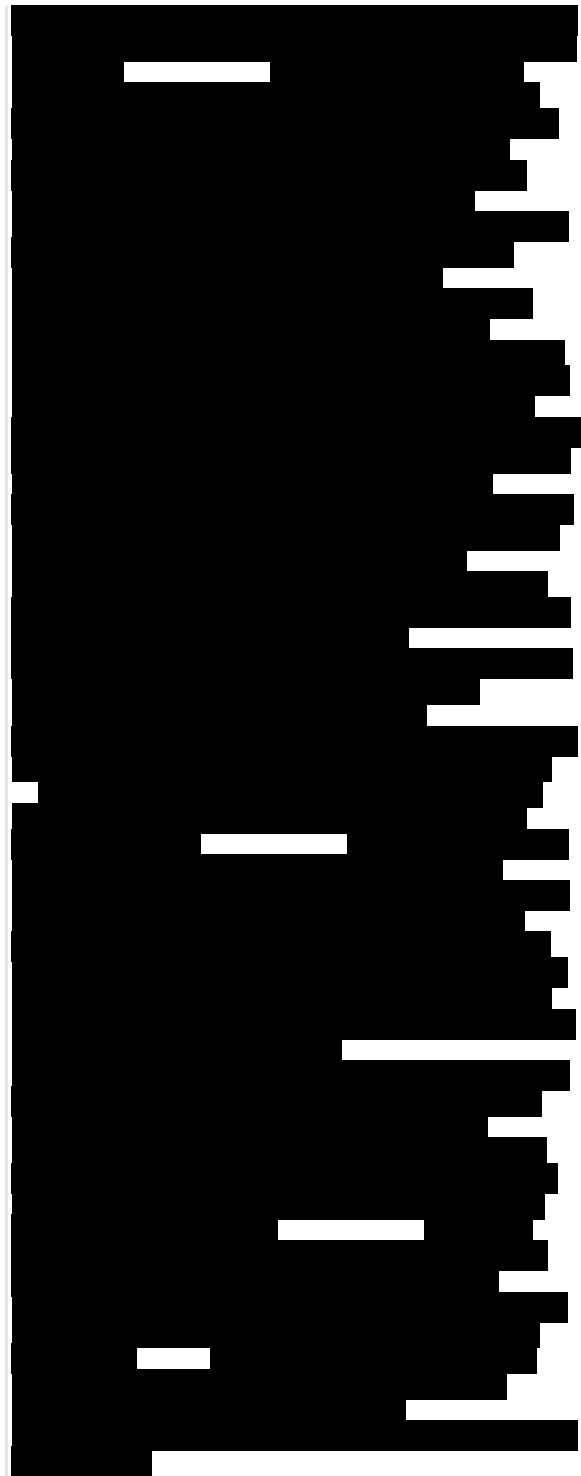



RE: Ord 20-16 Amending Sec. 22-323 Stormwater Performance Standards

As all of you are aware, the City of Neenah was involved in litigation regarding the street and trail construction on Lakeshore Avenue. As part of this litigation, Plaintiffs read the City Code and believed that we were not following our own ordinances with regard to stormwater management. After meeting with Director Kaiser, and City Engineers Kummerow and Eckhart, it was determined that the City Code could be updated to make City practice more clear to ensure there was no additional confusion.

There are only two changes that are repeated throughout the ordinance:

1. Adding the word “additional” to make it clear that the City has always looked at only additional impervious area when making determinations of whether a project is required to meet stormwater management standards. (As an example, if a project currently existed at 80,000 square feet of impervious area and it was going to be redone to be 60,000 square feet of impervious area, it would not need to meet the requirements of the ordinance because while the total project is over 20,000 square feet, in actuality the new area will be smaller than the current area.)
2. Adding multi-modal trails to the list of exemptions in the protective area. Following DNR regulations, this is what City practice has always been. Loop the lake, Riverside Park, Shattuck Park all have trails which were built in a protective area. It is important to note that even with an exemption from the City Code, all projects are still required to meet the standards of the state DNR.

These changes to the language will not change how the City has always enforced and interpreted the ordinance, they are just making the ordinance more clear to ensure that we do not run into further issues because of clarity.

An appropriate motion would be for the Committee to recommend Council approve Ordinance 2020-16 amending Section 22-323 of the City Code relating to stormwater performance standards.

AN ORDINANCE

The Common Council of the City of Neenah, Wisconsin, do ordain as follows:

Section 1. Section 22-323(c)(1) of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Neenah is amended by adding the highlighted language to read as follows:

- (c) *Requirements.* The stormwater management plan shall meet the following minimum requirements to the maximum extent practicable:
 - (1) *Water Quality.* BMPs shall be designed, installed and maintained to control pollutants carried in runoff from the post-construction site. The design shall be based on the average annual rainfall, as compared to no runoff management controls.
 - a. The following is required for post-construction sites with one or more of the following: 20,000 square feet or more of additional impervious surface disturbance, or one acre or more of additional land disturbance.
 - 1. Except as provided in subsection 22-323(c)(1)a.2., a pollutant reduction is required as follows:

- 2. A pollutant reduction is not required for routine maintenance areas that are part of a post-construction site with less than 5 acres of disturbance.

- b. For post-construction sites with less than 20,000 square feet of additional impervious surface disturbance, reduce the pollutant load using BMPs from the City of Neenah Storm Water Reference Guide. These sites are not required to satisfy a numeric performance standard.
- c. Sites with a cumulative addition of 20,000 square feet or greater of impervious surfaces after September 3, 2008 are required to satisfy the performance standards within subsections 22-323(c)(1)a.1. and 2.
- d. The amount of pollutant control previously required for the site shall not be reduced as a result of the proposed development or disturbance.
- e. When designing BMPs, runoff draining to the BMP from offsite areas shall be taken into account in determining the treatment efficiency of the practice. Any impact on the BMP efficiency shall be compensated for by increasing the size of the BMP accordingly. The pollutant load reduction provided by the BMP for an offsite area shall not be used to satisfy the required onsite pollutant load reduction, unless otherwise approved by the administering authority in accordance with subsection 22-323(e).
- f. If the design cannot meet the water quality performance standards of subsections 22-323(c)(1)a. through e., the storm water management plan shall include a written, site specific explanation of why the water quality performance standard cannot be met and why the pollutant load will be reduced only to the maximum extent practicable. Except as provided in subsection 22-323(f), the administering authority may not require any person to exceed the applicable water quality performance standard to meet the requirements of maximum extent practicable.

Section 2. Section 22-323(c)(2) of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Neenah is amended by adding the highlighted language to read as follows:

(2) *Peak discharge.* BMPs shall be designed, installed and maintained to control peak discharges from the post-construction site.

- a. The following is required for post-construction sites with one or more of the following: 20,000 square feet or more of additional impervious surface disturbance, or one acre or more of additional land disturbance.
 - 1. The peak post-development discharge rate shall not exceed the peak pre-development discharge rate for the one-year, two-year, ten-year, and 100-year, 24-hour design storms. These peak discharge requirements apply to new development and redevelopment areas. No peak discharge control is required for routine maintenance areas, unless runoff from the routine maintenance area discharges into a proposed peak flow control facility.
 - 2. Peak discharge calculations shall use TR-55 methodology. Atlas 14 rainfall depths and the MSE4 rainfall distribution shall be used unless the site is to be served by a previously constructed peak discharge facility. At the permittee's discretion, the TP-40 rainfall depths and the Type II rainfall distribution can be used for sites that are to be served by a previously constructed peak discharge facility. The meaning of "hydrologic soil group" and "runoff curve number" are as determined in TR-55. Unless the site is currently woodland, peak pre-development discharge rates shall be determined using the following runoff curve numbers for a "meadow" vegetative cover:

Maximum Pre-Development Runoff Curve Numbers

Vegetative Cover	A	B	C	D
Meadow	30	58	71	78
Woodland	30	55	70	77

- b. For post-construction sites with less than 20,000 square feet of [additional](#) impervious surface disturbance, reduce peak post-development discharge rates using BMPs from the City of Neenah Storm Water Reference Guide. These sites are not required to satisfy a numeric performance standard.
- c. Sites with a cumulative addition of 20,000 square feet or greater of impervious surfaces after September 3, 2008 are required to satisfy the performance standards within subsections [22-323\(c\)\(2\)a.1.](#) and 2.
- d. The amount of peak discharge control previously required for the site shall not be reduced as a result of the proposed development or disturbance.
- e. When designing BMPs, runoff draining to the BMP from offsite areas shall be taken into account in determining the performance of the practice. Any impact on the BMP performance shall be compensated for by increasing the size of the BMP accordingly. The peak discharge reduction provided by the BMP for an offsite area shall not be used to satisfy the required onsite peak discharge reduction, unless otherwise approved by the administering authority in accordance with subsection 22-323(e).
- f. An adequate outfall shall be provided for each point of concentrated discharge from the post-construction site. An adequate outfall consists of non-erosive discharge velocities and reasonable downstream conveyance.
- g. *Exemptions.* The peak discharge performance standards do not apply to the following:
1. A transportation facility where the discharge is directly into a lake over 5,000 acres or a stream or river segment draining more than 500 square miles.
 2. Except as provided under subsections 22-323(c)(2)d.—f., a highway reconstruction site.
 3. Except as provided under subsections 22-323(c)(2)d.—f., a transportation facility that is part of a redevelopment project.

Section 3. Section 22-323(c)(4) of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Neenah is amended by adding the highlighted language to read as follows:

(4) *Protective areas.*

- e. *Exemptions.* The following areas are not required to meet the protective area requirements of subsection 22-323(c)(4):
1. Redevelopment and routine maintenance areas provided the minimum requirements within subsection 22-323(c)(4)d. are satisfied.
 2. Structures that cross or access surface waters such as boat landings, bridges and culverts.
 3. Structures constructed in accordance with Wis. Stats § 59.692(1v).
 4. Areas of post-construction sites from which the runoff does not enter the surface water, including wetlands, without first being treated by a BMP to meet the requirements of

subsection 22-323(c)(1) and (2), except to the extent that vegetative ground cover is necessary to maintain bank stability.

5. Areas of post-construction sites with less than 20,000 square feet of additional impervious surface disturbance, or less than one acre of land disturbance.

6. Multi-modal trails

Section 4. Severability. In the event any section, subsection, clause, phrase or portion of this ordinance is for any reason held illegal, invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, such portion shall be deemed a separate, distinct and independent provision, and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remainder of this ordinance. It is the legislative intent of the Common Council that this ordinance would have been adopted if such illegal provision had not been included or any illegal application had not been made.

Section 5. Repeal and Effective Date. All ordinances or parts of ordinances and resolutions in conflict herewith are hereby repealed. This ordinance shall take effect from and after its passage and publication.

RE: Ord 20-17 Creating Sec. 11-57 Metal Detectors Prohibited on Public Lands and Right of Way

During the course of the archeological mitigation on Lakeshore Ave, it was determined that the area was used as a burial spot for the Native Americans. As such, the entire greenspace along Lakeshore is now categorized as either a “catalogued or uncatalogued burial site.” Such a classification means that, under state law, it is illegal for anyone to use a metal detector or dig on this land.

In conversations with the archeologists and the tribes, there was a concern that the area that makes up Kimberly Point Park likely also was a burial site given the location. This led to the question of what the City’s rules were regarding metal detectors and digging on public lands. There is currently no such ordinance in place. After consulting with Director Kaiser, Director Kading, and City Attorney Godlewski, it was determined that the best option would be to create an ordinance that would ban all metal detecting activity and digging from any publicly owned land and right-of-way.

The ordinance provides that a person may ask for a permit from the department head responsible for the specific area or the City Attorney and that, if the reason is valid, they would be allowed to use the metal detector for the specific purpose requested. (This exemption would not apply to the Lakeshore Right of Way because that is under State Law)

An appropriate motion would be for the Committee to recommend Council approve Ordinance 2020-17 creating section 11-57 of the City Code prohibiting use metal detectors and digging on publicly owned property and right of way.

AN ORDINANCE

The Common Council of the City of Neenah, Wisconsin, do ordain as follows:

Section 1. Section 11-57 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Neenah is created to read as follows:

Sec. 11-57 Use of Metal Detectors and Digging on Public Property Prohibited

(a) Definitions. As used in this section, the following terms shall have the meanings indicated:

Metal Detectors: Any device that gives an audible or other signal when it is close to metal, typically used to search for lost or buried items.

Publicly Owned Property: Any property owned by the City of Neenah

- (b) The use of metal detectors or digging for buried objects on any publicly owned property or public Right Of Way is prohibited.
- (c) Exception. If the City, after hearing evidence indicating a strong necessity, finds that a metal detector must be used on publicly owned property or Right of Way, the Director of Public Works, Director of Parks and Recreation, or the City Attorney may issue a no-cost permit to the requesting party for the specific location required to be searched.
- (d) Penalties: Any person who shall violate this section shall pay a forfeiture of \$200 plus costs.

Section 2. Severability. In the event any section, subsection, clause, phrase or portion of this ordinance is for any reason held illegal, invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, such portion shall be deemed a separate, distinct and independent

provision, and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remainder of this ordinance. It is the legislative intent of the Common Council that this ordinance would have been adopted if such illegal provision had not been included or any illegal application had not been made.

Calls for Service

The following three slides have statistics that are harvested from the Computer Aided Dispatch system (CAD), which has evolved and been revised over time. Dispatched call types have changed names, and the types of calls being recorded have gone through changes and modifications as well. The statistics shown are accurate, according to the information available from the CAD system in place during the time the calls for service were entered.

Some calls may be dispatched out differently depending on the dispatcher. For example, a homicide may come in as a Disturbance, Disturbance Weapon, Weapon or a Death.

Call categories can also be self initiated by officers doing added patrol for complaints or requests, such as: Building Security, Community Policing, Crime Prevention, Open Door, and Traffic Safety.

Some call categories can be used for different incidents:

- Assist, Miscellaneous and Informational can be used for just about anything that a dispatcher doesn't believe fits in a normal category.
- 911 Assist and 911 Hang-ups are both 911 calls going into dispatch. Hang-ups are when the person dials and immediately hangs up. 911 Assists can sometimes be open lines (like a pocket dial) or even a child playing with the phone.
- Firework complaints can either be dispatched as Fireworks, Noise Complaints or even Ordinance (since it is a city ordinance violation). It all depends on the dispatcher working and how they typically enter a call. Ordinance calls can also mean that an officer came across an ordinance violation on their own (juvenile out after curfew, someone in the park after hours, etc).
- Jail calls can also mean different things. It can mean that someone at the jail wants to report a crime that occurred in Neenah while they were incarcerated, that someone at the jail needs to be transported to another jail, etc.

- 1) Contract 7-19 (Breezewood Sanitary Sewer) – Work is complete.
- 2) Contract 1-20 (Abby, Bond, Center, Clybourn) Utility work is complete. Paving on Bond is scheduled for 10/9. The other streets will follow.
- 3) Contract 2-20 (Utilities - Van, Monroe) – Work is complete. A final estimate is being prepared.
- 4) Contract 3-20 (Street - Van, Monroe, Gillingham)
 - a) Gillingham, Van, Monroe, Cavalry – Work is complete.
 - b) Shootingstar – Work is on hold pending resolution of boundary issues. A CSM is being prepared.
- 5) Contract 4-20 (Green Bay, Tullar, Marathon)
 - a) Tullar, Marathon – Work is complete.
 - b) Green Bay – Water main work is complete. Concrete pavement was placed on the east side of the street. Pavement along the west side will be placed the week of October 12.
- 6) Contract 5-20 (Utilities - Lakeshore) – Utility work is complete except for the northernmost storm sewer outfall.
- 7) Contract 6-20 (Millview Drive Utility Relocation) – Mainline storm sewer and sanitary sewer relocation is complete. Some miscellaneous utility work and pavement repair remains.

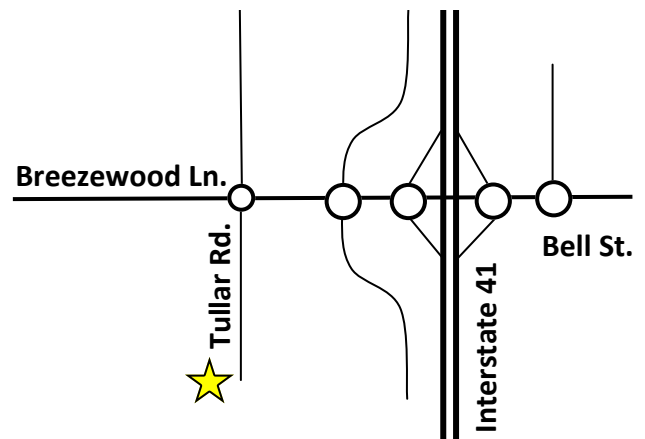
