A quorum was not present; no action was taken.

Discussion on Committee on Aging with City of Neenah Brian Borchardt:

Mayor Borchardt discussed initiatives that he is undertaking to improve communication, including the hiring of an outreach specialist and dissemination of information through local news outlets as well as the use of social media and livestreaming of meetings.

Chair Kristi Branchford discussed the School for Seniors event to be held in October, which reaches close to 100 people each year, and is primarily funded with donations. Future budget needs of the committee were discussed, and ways to conduct projects in a cost effective manner including grants and sponsorship.

Mayor Borchardt indicated that standalone services and spaces are unlikely in the future, and partnering with other organizations will be preferred. He and committee members discussed communication about the committee and its activities and ideas for further involvement in the community, such as learning more about community needs through a survey. Committee members discussed some of the challenges of older adults, such as isolation concerns and the need for better access to community services. The committee continues to seek ways to serve and would like to be involved in the Mayor's initiatives.

The committee structure was discussed and Mayor Borchardt reported that a Common Council representative will be appointed to serve on the committee.
