Present: Chair Kristi Branchford, Vice-Chair Mike Veith, and committee members Susan Antonneau, Pati Goodman, and Mary Nackers. (Four present in person, two present on Teams.) **Also Present:** Assistant Planner Carol Kasimor, and Lori Duclon, Winnebago County Health Department.

Public Appearances:

Lori Duclon reported that radon test kits can be obtained at the Neenah office of the Winnebago County Health Department, 211 N. Commercial Street, at a discounted rate of \$5 during January 2026, Radon Action Month.

Wellness Plus classes such as Strong Bodies continue in Neenah at the Neenah-Menasha YMCA, Menasha Senior Center, Valley VNA, and Highlands at Mahler Park. The Health Department can also help access the Wisconsin Well Woman Program (WWWP), which provides breast and cervical cancer screening to low income, uninsured or underinsured persons. Flu and COVID-19 cases continue at a high rate in the area.

Kristi Branchford from Valley VNA reported that they have 2026 educational presentations and the Lyrics and Laughter program for those experiencing memory loss scheduled. Enhanced respite is also available.

Approval of minutes of the November 20, 2025 meeting:

Discussion of committee purpose and future direction:

Committee members discussed membership requirements, including having Common Council representation.
