Chairman Lendrum called the meeting to order at 5:00 PM

#### Replacement of Fleet #18 (One-Ton Dump Truck)

Public Works Superintendent Radtke stated that this is a replacement for a smaller one-ton dump truck. He stated that the state bid by Napleton was the low bid at \$68,306.00. He stated that the budgeted amount was \$80,000.00. He stated that this truck will have a stainless-steel box to avoid rusting.

Public Works Superintendent Radtke stated that staff are also requesting that the existing 2006 Ford F-250 dump truck remain in the fleet pending major repairs due to the lack of small dump trucks.

Motion by Weber, seconded by Borchardt to recommend the Common Council approve the purchase of a 2026 Chevrolet Silverado 3500 Dump Truck with a Monroe Dump Box from Napleton Autowerks, Columbus WI, for \$68,306.00, and approve the purchase of a 2-way radio and additional safety items/lighting in an amount not to exceed \$2,000.00. Funding to come from Capital Equipment fund.

Chairman Lendrum suspended the rules to allow open dialogue on agenda items, 4,5, and 6.

#### Discuss 2026 Yard Waste Schedule Changes

Public Works Superintendent Radtke reviewed the change to yard waste collection in 2025. He stated that there was quite a bit of resident feedback regarding the changes that were made to the collection schedule. He stated that most of the feedback was that we started too early.

Public Works Superintendent Radtke stated that staff discussed options to resolve the comments from residents. He stated that the staff is recommending collection starting in May instead of April. He stated that the collection schedule would be May, June, August, and October. The same number of months but starting one month later.

Alderman Pollow stated that last year when the discussion to change the schedule to every other month was proposed, the reason was to reallocate labor that was previously used for yard waste collection to perform other duties. He stated that he would like a report on how the reallocated labor was used and if changing the schedule was beneficial.

Public Works Superintendent Radtke stated that twice as much hot mix was put down filling potholes. He stated that 12,000 lbs. of mastic was put down compared to just 4,000 lbs. in 2024. He stated that the mastic is used for filling larger cracks and trip hazards in the road, making manholes flush with the road and repairing longer stretches of cracked asphalt that is damaged along the curbline. Public Works Superintendent Radtke stated that we went from taking 4 days to collect yard waste down to 2 days. Public Works Superintendent Radtke stated that residents have been using the drop-off site much more to dispose of their yard waste. He stated that is what we hoped would be the case with the change in schedule.

Alderman Pollnow was encouraged to hear the benefit of the schedule change and stated that we should not lose sight of why the change was made. He stated that if the change has proven to be beneficial, we should consider continuing with the current schedule.

Office Manager Mroczkowski stated that the callers she talked to said April was too early to start yard waste collection. She stated that the majority of the callers did not have time to start to work in their yards yet.

Further discussion was held, and the Committee's consensus was to move April collection to May and then the normal even month collection of June, August and October.

### <u>Discuss Parameters for Future Agenda Items</u>

Alderman Pollnow stated that he feels that it is important to have an open agenda items list, so agenda items are not forgotten about. He stated that he would like to see this posted on the intranet.

Alderman Weber asked what is done with the list. Office Manager Mroczkowski stated it is kept in her Public Services and Safety Committee folder. She stated it is reviewed periodically by Director Kaiser.

The Committee had a lengthy discussion on whether the future agenda list should be posted on the intranet, how this list integrates with Council directives, reviewing the list quarterly, being transparent with the Common Council, what other committees do to track their outstanding items, and the need to establish a common practice for all committees.

Further discussion was held by the Committee to reach out to Mr. Foth from the League of Wisconsin Municipalities for his opinion on what other cities do in this situation or using our City Attorney to provide his opinion.

The consensus of the Committee was to reach out to Mr. Foth of the League of Wisconsin Municipalities for his opinion and also consult the City Attorney.

#### Discuss Police Department Quarterly Statistic Report

Chairman Lendrum stated that she would like to propose that the Police Department's quarterly statistic report be included in Chief Olson's Weekly Report email, instead of being reported out through this committee. She stated that the Common Council would still be receiving the data but through a different channel.

Alderman Pollnow stated that he does not agree with the suggested change. He stated that bringing this report to committee allows questions to be asked. He stated it is great tool to learn about trends in crime in the City of Neenah and other communities. He stated that it also provides transparency for the police department.

Alderman Borfhcardt stated that if he has questions about the report he will reach out to Chief Olson. He stated that he does not see a need to review it page by page. He stated it can be presented to committee and then open it up for questions, that would be his suggestion.

The consensus of the Committee was that the Police Department's Quarterly Statistic Report continue to be reported out to the Public Services and Safety Committee.

### Public Works General Construction and Department Activity Report

- 1) S. Commercial Street:
  - Several overlapping operations will be taking place until the project is completed.
     These operations include grading for and placing sidewalk and driveway aprons on the east side; placing asphalt tie-ins for driveways and side streets; traffic signal cabling and cabinet installation; and landscaping.
- 2) Contract 7-21 (Harrison Pond): Work under the contract is complete. A final pay request is being prepared.
- 3) Contract 4-24 (S. Park Avenue Easement Utilities): Work is complete. Punchlist items including a manhole repair and fence repair are being completed. A final pay request is being prepared.
- 4) Contract 7-24 (Misc Concrete Pavement/Sidewalk Repair): The majority of the work is complete. The sidewalk on the west side of the north end of Baldwin will be done when arrangements have been finalized with the abutting property owner.
- 5) Contract 13-24 (S. Commercial St Turn Lane at Winneconne Av): The contract was awarded to Vinton Construction. The work has not been scheduled. We are working through property acquisition.
  - Director Kaiser stated the land acquisition paperwork was signed on Monday, September 22, 2025.
- 6) Contract 1-25 (Alexander, Lexington, Forest Manor Ct, Bruce, Southfield Plat Utilities and Street): Utility work, concrete work, and paving are complete. Landscaping and clean-up remain.
  - Director Kaiser stated that all that is left to do is pick up the barricades.
- 7) Contract 2-25 (Elm, Douglas Utilities and Street): Work is complete. A punchlist items are being addressed and final quantities are being prepared.
- 8) Contract 3-25 (Caroline, Hickory Utility and Street Construction):
  - a) Caroline: Utilities are complete. Street construction starts the week of 9/22.
  - b) Hickory: Utility work is complete. Street work is expected to start in early October.
- 9) Contract 4-25 (Misc Concrete Pavement/Sidewalk Repair): The contractor is starting work on the sidewalk repair list.
- 10) Contract 10-25 (City Hall Window Replacement): OMNI Glass & Paint has done measurements and are finalizing shop drawings. Installation is projected to start in early December.
- 11) Nicolet/Commercial Roundabout Study: The draft report has been received and comments returned to the consultant. When the final report is received, it will be presented to Committee. Staff met with our Menasha counterparts to discuss arranging a joint meeting of the Councils to determine next steps.

Director Kaiser stated that the final report was received on Monday, September 22, 2025. He stated that he has talked with Director Merten and have agreed to a joint meeting of the Common Councils on how to proceed with the project.

**RE:** GRAEF Arrowhead Park Contract Amendment No. 2

The City contracted with GRAEF Engineering in September of 2024 to complete preliminary engineering, design, and a feasibility analysis of several key components of the Arrowhead Park Master Plan. In 2025, as part of the engineering work and conversations with the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources (WDNR) staff regarding the proposed uses on the 30-acre site, there was a need for additional effort and work from GRAEF and their subcontractors beyond the originally approved contract and scope.

Additional tasks that city staff requested that GRAEF complete are WDNR requirements for highly detailed design documents, a formal WDNR Plan Modification Development Request Report, providing information to WDNR based on requests for information, and attending additional coordination meetings and providing correspondences to the City and/or WDNR/City collectively.

GRAEF has requested a contract amendment in the amount of \$56,183 to account for these additional tasks. The tasks in the original contract and the first amendment are completed.

#### **Recommendations**

Appropriate action is to recommend Council approve the contract Amendment No. 2 with GRAEF Engineering in the amount of \$56,183 for professional services for Arrowhead Park engineering tasks and guidance. Funding for the Amendment to be provided from Arrowhead Park carry forward funds included in the 2025 Capital Improvements Budget.







## MEMORANDUM

**DATE:** October 24, 2025

**TO:** Mayor Lang and Members of the Public Services and Safety Committee

FROM: Gerry Kaiser, Director of Public Works

**RE**: Drop-off Center Card Distribution (Discussion)

Since creating the access card for the drop-off center, the cards have been distributed with a mass mailing in February. In 2026, we propose to eliminate the mass mailing and have residents pick up their card in person at either City Hall or at the Tullar Garage. This change will eliminate mailing costs, reduce conflicts with residents looking for replacement cards, and give us a better handle on card distribution and use. It is part of our ongoing goal to improve operation of the drop-off center. While staff time involved in card distribution will increase, we believe that the benefits of this approach will outweigh that negative.

FROM: Gerry Kaiser, Director of Public Works

**RE:** Request to Raze the former Doty Avenue Bus Shelter

Since the relocation of the downtown Neenah bus stop, the former bus shelter at the corner of Doty Avenue and Church Street has been vacant. The city built the shelter in the mid-1980s as part of the downtown redevelopment. We have recently had some vandalism to the building and are reluctant to make repairs if the structure is to remain unused and a target for further vandalism. Alternative uses for the building have been explored by FNI but costs associated with adapting the building for another use have been cost prohibitive. Given these circumstances, staff request permission to raze the building. With the exception of relocating the electrical service, city crews would handle the razing. The electrical service will be relocated to the wall of the dumpster corral and continue to feed the adjacent decorative streetlight and a camera that oversees the dumpster corral. A concrete pad would be poured at the location of the shelter.

The appropriate motion would be to recommend that Council authorize staff to raze the city-owned former bus shelter at the northeast corner of Church Street and Doty Avenue.

#### Class "B" (Beer):

- a. The governing body shall establish any waiting period before granting of a license for events lasting less than 4 days (sec. 125.04(3)(f), Wis. Stats.)
- b. At least 15 days prior to the granting of the license for events lasting 4 or more days.

#### "Class B" (Wine):

The application shall be filed with the clerk of the local municipality in which the event will be held at least 15 days prior to the granting of the license.

- (4) Seller's Permit: (sec. 77.54 (7m), Wis. Stats.), provides an exemption from Wisconsin sales and use taxes relating to certain sales by a nonprofit organization. Check the box if your organization qualifies for the exemption and therefore is not required to hold a seller's permit.
- (5) Publication: Not required. (sec. 125.04(3)(g), Wis. Stats.)

- (3) License may cover either a specified area or the entire picnic grounds. (secs. 125.26(6) and 125.51(10), Wis. Stats.)
- (4) License issued to a county or district fair must cover the entire fairgrounds (secs. 125.26(6) and 125.51(10), Wis. Stats.)
- (5) No license to clubs having any indebtedness to any wholesaler for more than 15 days for beer (sec. 125.33(7), Wis. Stats.) and 30 days for wine (s. 125.69(4)(b), Wis. Stats.)
- (6) Licensed operator(s) must be present at all times (secs. 125.17, 125.26(6), 125.32(2) Beer; 125.17, 125.51(10), 125.68(2) Wine; Wis. Stats.)
- (7) The licensed club, club members, or any other persons are not permitted to possess intoxicating liquor on licensed premises on the Temporary Class "B"/"Class B" licensed picnic area. (sec. 125.32(6), Wis. Stats.)
- (8) Not more than 2 wine licenses may be issued to any club, county or local fair association, agricultural association, church, lodge, society, chamber of commerce or similar civic or trade organization or veterans' post in any 12 month period. A municipality may issue up to 20 wine licenses to the same licensee if: 1) each license is issued for the same date and times, 2) the licensee is the sponsor of an event held at multiple locations within the municipality on this date and at these times, 3) an admission fee is charged for participation in the event and no additional fee is charged for service of alcohol beverages at the event, and 4) within the immediately preceding 12-month period, the municipality has issued these multiple licenses for fewer than 2 events. In addition, each event for which multiple licenses are issued shall count as one license toward the 2-license limit. (sec. 125.51(10), Wis. Stats.)
- (9) Licensed organizations must purchase their alcohol beverages only from permitted Wisconsin wholesalers, breweries and brewpubs. (secs. 125.33(6), and 125.69(6), Wis. Stats.)

Dear Ms. Stone:

Your appeal for the designation of your dog, Hank, in your possession or control, as a dangerous animal under Neenah Code §3-16 has been scheduled for a hearing before the Public Services & Safety Committee as captioned above. A copy of Patrol Lieutenant Wesley Bone's dangerous dog designation is attached plus additional documentation that will be presented to the committee. You **must** be in attendance for the hearing to occur.

You may retrain an attorney to represent you at the hearing if you so choose. You should be prepared to present evidence and give testimony regarding your appeal. Neither the City Attorney, nor Lt. Bone, can give advice on legal matters or your rights with respect to the same.

By way of process, the hearing will be similar to a court hearing, but not as formal. The City Attorney, along with Lt. Bone, will present the city's case first. At the conclusion of the city's presentation, you will have an opportunity to cross-examine Lt. Bone or any witnesses who testified on behalf of the city. Then you will have an opportunity to present your response, including any witnesses or documents you wish for the committee to consider. The committee may also ask questions of witnesses during the course of the hearing.

After both sides have finished presenting their sides, the Committee will deliberate the case in open session, and render at decision. The Committee's decision is final, however, may be appealed to Winnebago County Circuit Court.

My name is Shallin Stone and a letter regarding my animal was recently delivered to my home. I unfortunately was not home until this weekend and was unable to make it within the 5-day period to deliver this letter for a request of appeal. I would have called and left a message immediately this weekend, however my roommate who received the letter from the police dept. when he read it misunderstood and thought that I had 30 days to appeal, and I did not get a chance to read the letter until this morning, which is when I took immediate action.

He is licensed and up to date on all of his vaccinations including distemper and rabies.

I am asking you to please extend that 5 days to today and give me the opportunity to appeal this decision about my animal.

Hank has saved my life in more ways than I can describe and though he had a couple of instances with other animals that were unfortunate, he did not act unprovoked, and he is not a dangerous animal to people.

We have just this week picked up all of the fence panels that we need to put up a 4-foot-tall thick wooden fence that will guarantee to keep him separated from other animals that may venture into our yard, or that may provoke negative behavior.

He is my best friend, and I would appreciate the chance.

#### **Narrative**

On the above date and approximate time, I was dispatched to an animal complaint for a dog bite victim in the Theda Care Emergency Department, 130 2nd St. in the city of Neenah.

Upon my arrival, I was met with the bite victim, Aria Graff, and she said that she was walking two dogs when a pitbull from 603 Sherry St. broke its leash and attacked her and one of the dogs. She does not own the dogs, just walks them. Aria's mom provided me with the dog owner's information of the pitbull, the injured dog owner's information, and witness information. I was able to take photos of Aria's injury to her right hand which is described as a slight gaping laceration with about 2 cm depth. Pictures of the injury were taken with and without scale and uploaded to Axon Capture. The bite/scratch worksheet was completed with Aria. I provided Aria and her mom with a Crime Victim Information Form along with the case report number.

At approximately 4:30 PM, I met with the owner of the pitbull, Shallin Stone, at her residence. She explained that the leash was tied to a post in the ground and it ripped out. Her dog is described as a gray pitbull with a white chest named Hank. The bite/scratch worksheet was completed with Shallin. She was able to make contact with the vet clinic, Heritage Animal Hospital, and provided a copy of the vaccination paperwork. I explained to her that her dog would have to complete a vaccinated quarantine order. I read the vaccinated quarantine order along with subsections A, B, and C, verbatim. When asked about animal licensing, Shallin said she did not have one since she got her dog two weeks ago. I explained that she would be receiving a fix it

citation for no City of Neenah Animal License and how to obtain one. I told her that if she were to provide proof of the purchase, it would be amended to a warning. She understood everything explained to her. I did call her after I left her residence to warn her for animals at large. I explained what animals at large is and if it were to happen again, she could receive a citation.

CSA Maggie Bakken spoke to the witness of the attack, Mary Flood, in person and she said she heard the screaming for help and ran over to help Aria. She showed CSA Maggie and I the spot where Aria and the dog were attacked. She said there was puddles of blood, which the spot had since been sprayed off. I took a photo of the spot and uploaded it to Axon Capture.

I was able to make contact with the injured dog owner, Karen Blohm, over the phone. She said that she brought her dog to Blue Pearl Vet Hospital right away after the incident and would not be home until later. She said her dog was bloody and injured on his butt and ear. No other information about the injuries were provided. She agreed to meet with a CSA tomorrow, 03/14/2025, to complete a bite/scratch worksheet. Photos should be taken of the injuries as well as veterinarian bills if the dog needed any stitches or surgery.

I issued Shallin Stone citation number 2J804SFB0W for no City of Neenah Animal License. It is to be mailed to her address, 603 Sherry St.

The officer's copy of the citation, the bite/scratch worksheet, quarantine order, driver's license record, and vaccination paperwork will be turned in with this report.

Further follow up consists of receiving the completed quarantine order from Shallin Stone and meeting with Karen Blohm. MP/sds/lp

Dear Shallin Stone,

I have reviewed case number 25-004028 involving your dog, Hank. Hank is 2 year old gray and white, Pitbull. Hank is reported to have attacked another dog, without provocation, causing injuries that required stitches.

Based on the information available to me, I am declaring your animal a Potentially Dangerous Animal at this time. This designation carries no specific requirements or restrictions. However, I am very concerned about his behavior, and I am reaching out to you for assistance to make sure there are no future incidents.

Neenah's animal control ordinance #3-1 defines three levels of dangerous animals:

A <u>Potentially Dangerous Animal</u> is any animal that bites a human or domestic animal either on public or private property without causing great or substantial bodily harm, or chases or approaches a person upon the streets, sidewalks, or any public grounds in a menacing fashion or apparent attitude of attack, or any animal with a known propensity, tendency, or disposition to attack unprovoked, or to cause injury or otherwise to threaten the safety of humans or domestic animals.

A <u>Dangerous Animal</u> is one that has attacked or bitten a person or pet, unprovoked, and has either inflicted substantial bodily harm (which includes an injury that requires stitches or tissue adhesive) or has been declared a potentially dangerous animal in the past three years and has a second incident.

A Prohibited Dangerous Animal is one that inflicts great bodily harm. The owner must either have the animal euthanized or relocate it.

Douglas informed me he would be taking his dog to Wellness Veterinarian clinic. The dog can be described as a black and white rottweiler border collie mix, named Roxy. Roxy had a puncture on the top of her nose and a mild scratch on the right side of her neck. Photographs of the wounds and the dog were uploaded via Axon capture.

Upon my arrival to 603 Sherry St, I met with a male who verbally identified himself as Lamont A Ebert. Lamont stated the dog was on a restraint but broke off. The dog can be described as a grey pitbull with a white stomach named Hank. Lamont also stated he was indoors at the time of the incident, and it took him a few minutes to respond to what was going on. Lamont informed me the primary owner of the dog is Shallin S Stone. I made contact with Shallin via phone and informed her of the situation. Shallin understood and had no further questions. I filled out the animal bite scratch worksheet with Lamont and a quarantine order. I spoke to CSA Supervisor Bedora who informed me that since both dogs are vaccinated, there is no need for a quarantine order. I immediately informed Lamont about this and told him to disregard on the quarantine order. I also informed Lamont he would receive a citation of Animal at Large that will be delivered in the mail. Lamont understood and had no further questions.

The citation, animal bite/scratch worksheet, and a filled-out quarantine order that was voided will be attached with this report.

I have no further information on this case and it can be closed. JL / MLB/lp

Dear Shallin Stone,

I have reviewed case number 25-013387 involving your dog, Hank. Hank is a 3-year-old Pitbull, which is registered with the city of Neenah and is up to date with its vaccinations.

Hank is reported to have broken off his leash and, without provocation, attacked another dog that was being walked by its owner. This resulted in several injuries to the dog and a great deal of emotional stress to its owner. This is the second unprovoked attach this year. The first was reported on March 14, 2025, under report number 25-004028. Hank was declared a Potentially Dangerous Animal because of that attack.

Neenah's animal control ordinance #3-1 defines a dangerous animal as "any animal that (a) inflicts Substantial Bodily Harm on a human being or domestic animal without provocation on public or private property, (b) engages in, or is found to have been trained to engage in, exhibitions of fighting or (c) has been previously found, within the last 36 months, to be a Potentially Dangerous Animal, the owner having received notice of such and the animal again aggressively bites, attacks, or endangers the safety of humans or domestic animals."

Based on the information available to me, I am declaring Hank a **dangerous animal**. As a result of the declaration residence of the city of Neenah have four options:

- 1. You may comply with the dangerous animal control parameters established by ordinance. The following is required within 30 days of this letter:
  - a. Purchase a "dangerous animal" license through the city's finance department and affix it to the animal's collar. To obtain the license, you must provide the following to a Neenah Police Department Representative:
    - Provide proof of current vaccination and regular animal license
    - Provide proof of completed spaying or neutering
    - Provide animal's age, weight, color, breed, and identifying characteristics
    - Provide two 4"x6" color photographs of the animal
    - Provide proof of microchip implantation from a veterinarian







- Provide proof of liability insurance in an amount not less than \$1,000,000 for any personal injuries inflicted by the dangers animal
- b. After the dangerous animal license is obtained, the following rules apply for the animal
  - While off premise of the owner, the animal must wear a basket-type muzzle.
  - While off premise of the owner, the animal must be restrained by a substantial chain or leash no longer than six feet in length and under the direct supervision and control of a competent adult.
  - While indoors, the animal must be securely confined, without access to open windows or other potential exits.
  - When not leashed/muzzled or secured indoors, the animal must be secured in a pen
    or kennel that consists of a double metal fence separated by at least a two-foot gap,
    with secure sides and top attached on all sides and a secure bottom or floor (or side
    walls embedded no less than two feet into the ground), locked with a key or
    combination lock, and posted with signs declaring, "dangerous animal."

All of the above apply to the option of complying with the city ordinance and keeping the dangerous animal in the city. The other three options are:

- 2. You may move the dangerous animal outside the city limits, where city ordinance has no applicability. If you choose this option, you should be aware that the animal will be subject to ordinances of the local jurisdiction. Further, you would still be civilly liable for damages, injuries, or death caused by the animal. You will need to provide me with the name and address of the new caretaker for the animal.
- 3. You may choose to have the animal euthanized. This is a very difficult decision that may affect many family members. Please do not choose this option without careful consideration and input from those who may be affected. Consult with a veterinarian or other animal care professional when considering this option.
- 4. You may appeal this "dangerous animal" declaration. To invoke an appeal, you must file a written notice with the City Clerk **within five business days** of receiving this letter. Appeals will be heard by the Public Services and Safety Committee. Appeal of the council decision must be sought through circuit court.

#### **Narrative**

On the above date and time, I conducted follow up in regards to a dog vs dog incident, which took place on 09/25/2025 on the corner of Sherry Street and Harrison Street in the city of Neenah, Winnebago County.

I originally closed out the incident as a short form; however, was requested by CSA Supervisor Michaela Bedora to complete an Animal Bite Scratch Worksheet and a report. The incident that occurred on 09/25/2025 is as follows. I spoke with Brandon S. Parker, the owner of Pablo, a Blue Heeler. Brandon was sitting on the corner of Sherry Street and Harrison Street in front of 603 Sherry Street. With Brandon was Lamont A. Ebert, the owner of 603 Sherry Street.

Brandon provided the following verbal statement, which can be summarized as follows: Brandon stated around 6:00 PM, he was walking his leashed dog, Pablo, on the side sidewalk on the Harrison Street side of 603 Sherry Street. Brandon noticed a Pitbull in a harness but off a leash that began attacking his dog. Brandon was able to stop the dog from continuing to attack Pablo. Immediately after the attack, a female, later identified as Shallin S. Stone, came and took the Pitbull away. Shallin was then seen leaving with the Pitbull in pick up truck. Following this, Lamont came out and aided Brandon. Brandon explained that Pablo sustained a scratch/graze on his left ribcage area. I observed the mark and noticed it was wet and there was a slight red mark. No other injuries were reported to me. Brandon was unsure what provoked the attack on Pablo.

Lamont, who is the owner of the residence, but not the Pitbull, was cooperative and answered all my questions. Lamont explain that the Pitbull, named Hank, is owned by Shallin and he has no responsibility for it as it is Shallin's. Lamont made it clear he has no responsibility for the Pitbull and does not wish to have it as it is Shallin's responsibility. I was also advised during this time, this is the third incident of Hank being aggressive/biting another animal. Due to this, Shallin was going through the court's due to this issue and Lamont explained one of the requirements from the courts was to put a fence up, which he was working on because Shallin was residing at his residence.

At this time, is when I closed it as a short form and provided Brandon the incident number as I initially considered a civil issue.

On 10/02/2025, I revisited 603 Sherry Street and spoke with Lamont who provided me the details to complete the bite worksheet. I was unable to make contact with Shallin as she was not home and did not answer her cell phone. I also spoke with Brandon who provided me with the details of Pablo. Brandon also advised me a puncture wound was noticed on the outside of Pablo's left leg. Brandon did not bring Pablo in for treatment as he had family who were veterinarians, and he was advised by them to monitor the injuries.

I contacted the owner of the dog who was bit, Brandon Parker, over the phone to obtain photos of his dogs injury and he explained he is in Michigan until Sunday and will not be able to send the photos he has. We agreed to have photos taken of his dog, Pablo, on Monday, 10/06/2025. I attempted to contact Shallin at her residence; however, she was at a doctors appointment during that time.

At approximately 1:00 PM, I attempted to contact Shallin at her residence and was informed by a resident she left and will not return until Sunday. I attempted to contact her via phone call and it could not be completed. I left a text message for a phone call back regarding her dog.

Further follow up consists of taking photos of Pablo's injuries on Monday. As well as a citation for Animals at Large and Animals Causing Damage should issued to Shallin for this incident.

**RE:** Public Works General Activity

- 1) S. Commercial Street:
  - Work is complete. A punchlist has been provided to the contractor.
- 2) Contract 7-21 (Harrison Pond): Work under the contract is complete. A final pay request is being prepared.
- 3) Contract 4-24 (S. Park Avenue Easement Utilities): Work is complete. Punchlist items including a manhole repair and fence repair are being completed. A final pay request is being prepared.
- 4) Contract 13-24 (S. Commercial St Turn Lane at Winneconne Av): Staking and sawcutting are scheduled for 10/24. Utility work and pavement removals are scheduled for the week of 10/27 and paving scheduled for the following week.
- 5) Contract 1-25 (Alexander, Lexington, Forest Manor Ct, Bruce, Southfield Plat Utilities and Street): Work is complete. A final pay request is being prepared.
- 6) Contract 2-25 (Elm, Douglas Utilities and Street): Work is complete. A final pay request is being prepared.
- 7) Contract 3-25 (Caroline, Hickory Utility and Street Construction): Utility work, grading, concrete placement, and graveling are complete. Paving is scheduled for the week of Oct. 27.
- 8) Contract 4-25 (Misc Concrete Pavement/Sidewalk Repair): The contractor is starting work on the sidewalk repair list.
- 9) Contract 4-25 (Misc Asphalt Pavement Repair): The contractor is starting work on the sidewalk repair list.
- 10) Contract 10-25 (City Hall Window Replacement): OMNI Glass & Paint has done measurements and are finalizing shop drawings. Installation is projected to start in early December.
- 11) Fuel: Superintendent Radtke received proposals for fuel and fluids service and has been working with vendors to clarify proposals.
- 12) Courtside Fields Pond: Final quantities and specifications are being prepared for pond construction. We are looking to advertise for bids on the pond in the next two weeks.
- 13) Storm Water Management Plan Update: Staff received word that the City was awarded a grant from WDNR of \$75,900 for the storm water management plan update. A request for proposals has been prepared. WDNR will prepare a project agreement and review the RFP before it is issued to make sure that it fully captures the work approved in the grant.
